# **Support Categories**

### **Maintenance of Effort & Other Direct Payments**

Direct payments for City Schools operations.
Includes payments for teacher pensions and retiree health benefits.

### **Support Services**

 Services provided to City Schools, such as school nurses, crossing guards, and risk management/workers' compensation costs.

#### **Capital Support**


 Debt service and annual funding for school capital improvements, plus contributions to 21st Century Schools program for new or renovated schools.

### **Guaranteed Tax Base (GTB) Dollars**

 The City's contribution to City Schools for retiree health benefits generates additional State Aid dollars for schools.


### **Required Funding**



### Maintenance of Effort (MOE)

- State law requires counties/Baltimore City to provide a minimum level of funding, based on wealth calculations as compared to Statewide averages and enrollment.
- House Bill 684 (2017) required Baltimore City to provide additional support to schools from FY18 to FY20.
- Baltimore City has met or exceeded required funding levels since FY01.





## **Other Funding**



### **Support Services**

 The City provides support services, like the school nurse program & crossing guards.

# Key Takeaways

- 1. Since FY16, Baltimore City has exceeded mandated funding amounts.
- The mandated funding amount permanently increased in FY19 per HB684 (2017).
